What is Youth and Government?

How does it work?

- Established in 1936 with the motto: "Democracy must be learned by each generation"
- A national program that involves 150,000 participants in state-organized, model-government programs.
- Indiana YMCA Youth and Government (INYaG) is a program of the Indiana Alliance of YMCAs with more than 100 Hoosier participants from 13 cities.
- Girls and boys from grades 7-12 meet in their local INYaG delegations throughout the school year for leadership development and to discuss issues that affect citizens of our state and to propose legislation.
- Participants select from fascinating, in-depth programs areas focusing on the Indiana legislature, judiciary, government administration and media. There's even a special program for middle school students.
- The program culminates with teens taking over the Indiana Statehouse serving as delegates during the annual Model Government Conference

Delegations come from:

- YMCAs Local YMCAs serve as the conveners with INYaGtrained staff and volunteers facilitating delegation meetings
- Schools Delegations are hosted by local school, usually as an afterschool club, with teachers as sponsors and advisers trained by INYaG
- Community-based organizations Delegations are hosted and meetings are facilitated by community-based organizations like churches, community centers, clubs, etc.

What do you do?

- Meet in your school or your community, gain an awareness of social issues and develop your own possible solutions
- Attend regional and statewide leadership development and mock government experiences
- Advocate for your positions by debating and voting on legislation you and your friends developed, or making oral arguments that you develop for the judiciary
- Have fun making friends and getting to know Indiana students who want to make a difference just like you do

- Learn about important issues and the legislative process
- Hear and respect varying viewpoints
- Develop networking communication skills
- Polish your public speaking and professional writing skills
- Enhance your resume with an impressive accomplishment
- Master the etiquette of lawmaking and the art of compromise
